Nominations are being accepted at this time for the 2022 Annual Awards. Illinois Agri-Women recognize outstanding contributors to Illinois agriculture and our organization annually. Awards presented each year are: Hall of Fame, Outstanding Agri-Business and Outstanding Farmer. One does not have to be an IAW member to be nominated for an award.

Awards will be presented at the 2022 IAW Annual Meeting and our Hall of Fame recipient will also be recognized at the Illinois State Fair Ag Day festivities. To get the year aligned with ISF Ag Day, I'm designating 2020 a COVID year and we will present 2022 awards in the same year. A description of each award and past recipients are listed below.

Hall of Fame: this award is for members of IAW as well as non-members who have made highimpact contributions to Illinois Agriculture through her cooperation and leadership efforts.

Outstanding Illinois Woman Farmer: this award is for a woman who is involved with production agriculture and has exhibited exemplary skills in managing and operating her farm. Open to all women farming in Illinois. IAW members and non-members may be nominated.

Outstanding Illinois Agri-Business Professional: this award is for a woman who works in agribusiness and has exhibited high standards of service excellence and exceptional leadership skills in her job. Open to all women who hold an agribusiness position in Illinois including teaching and/or has Illinois as part of their sales territory. IAW members and non-members may be considered.
